To mark the 80th anniversary of the outbreak of the Second World War local historian Stephen Poulter will be giving a presentation in Needham Parish Church at 5.30pm on Sunday 10th November (just prior to the annual Remembrance Service at 6pm). The talk will show how the everyday lives of each citizen of Britain were turned upside down in the first week after war was declared in September 1939 by an extraordinary series of laws and regulations which imposed unprecedented restrictions on their freedom and liberty. In the Committee Room at the Village Hall after the Service we will be screening some short propaganda films made during the war.
