Ramblings from the Rectory – August 2023

This month my article is a little different. I write this following a very busy time with funerals. It is always a privilege to be with a family following a funeral and to conduct the funeral of their loved one. This reminded me of a story that I heard not long after moving to Harleston. It was a little story that was sent to me:

A minister had been to see a sick man. As he was leaving, the sick man turned and said to him, 'I am afraid to die. Tell me what lies on the other side..'

Very quietly, the minister said, 'I don't know..'

'You don't know? You're a Christian minister, and don't know what's on the other side?'

The minister was holding the handle of the door; on the other side came a sound of scratching and whining, and as he opened the door, a dog sprang into the room and leaped on him with joy.

Turning to the man, the minister said, 'Did you notice my dog? He's been waiting outside. He's never been in this room before. He didn't know what was inside. He knew nothing except that his master was here, and when the door opened, he sprang in without fear. I know little of what is on the other side of death, but I do know one thing: I know my Master is there and that is enough.'

That story made me think of all of those families. I know that I will see my Master. I know where I am going but for most people that I talk to death is the final enemy of life, at least that is how it appears from here. Talking about the sheepfold Jesus says, "The thief comes only to steal and kill and destroy; I have come that they may have life, and have it to the full." (John 10.10) If Jesus has come to give us life to the full, then life is indeed precious, a gift to be treasured, and the only life that we are sure of is this one.

We only know this earthly life, so the natural reaction to death is to be afraid. It is mine and the thief wants to steal it away. Will there be anything on the other side? If there is something on the other side, will it be good? How will I know? How can I be really sure?

Like that little story I don't find descriptions of heaven all that helpful. What helps me is what I learn here and now. I try and spend my time getting to know my Master better. The Holy Spirit makes that job a bit easier. I keep finding that there is more to learn and to love. But what I have mostly learned so far is that I'm loved, and loved, and loved some more. I can completely trust Jesus to have a place for me, wherever that may be.

I know that to be true. I pray that I will always have such faith, whatever the future may hold.


