A New Year and new beginnings. I wonder what 2024 will bring. When that clock strikes midnight and the fireworks go off, it is a New Year, but in a way, nothing changes. The world is still the same in the morning, good and bad. The difference is that with a New Year comes the hope of new beginnings.

Jesus the Messiah (Christ in Greek) is the hope for the Holy Land. That is the message of Christmas, yes it is still Christmas until 6th January, Epiphany, when we celebrate the arrival of the Magi (Wise Men). The celebration of Epiphany then keeps going until the end of January. Epiphany marks the point where that hope, narrow hope for the people of Israel becomes hope for the whole world. Changes to Communion


