#### Ramblings from the Rectory – July 2023

July begins with something very special for God's Church in this benefice. On Saturday 1<sup>st</sup> July, Revd. James Shelton, our curate, will be ordained priest in Norwich Cathedral. The day after that Josh Whitnall will be ordained deacon, again in Norwich Cathedral. For those of you who are confused about the terms, "deacon" means "servant" in Greek, and so a deacon is someone ordained by the church to serve the church and community. A priest is a leader, overseeing the work of the church. A priest is also a deacon and so should still be a servant at heart! If you want to know more, I have copied some of the words from the ordination services for deacons and priests, below this article.

Many of you will know both Josh and James. Josh has been with us here for nearly two years now, training for ministry and working in the parish. We will miss him and Beth and their two little daughters. Our loss though is someone else's gain. In this instance it is East Harling Benefice where Josh will be serving as a curate. Please join me in wishing them every blessing for their future ministry.

James, is shared between Harleston and Earsham Benefice. So he is well known in St. John's but less so in our other churches. James is already a deacon in the Church of England and after his ordination to the priesthood he will be learning what it is to lead in the church. He will be continuing to learn the skills that he will need as a minister and will be with us here for another two years, or so.

Josh and James are taking huge steps on a path of service and commitment. Service and commitment to God but also to the people around them, in and outside of the church community. Please pray for them and encourage them. However, deacons, priests and all ministers, are here to encourage Christ's people. They are not 'the Church', we all are. If the clergy were 'the Church' that would be to rob you of the gift of serving God. All of you have a calling from God, a purpose and work set out for you. Pray for us, but pray also for yourselves: Where is he calling you? How will you respond?

God bless, Nigel. <u>Deacons</u> are called to work with the Bishop and the priests with whom they serve as heralds of Christ's kingdom. They are to proclaim the gospel in word and deed, as agents of God's purposes of love. They are to serve the community in which they are set, bringing to the Church the needs and hopes of all the people. They are to work with their fellow members in searching out the poor and weak, the sick and lonely and those who are oppressed and powerless, reaching into the forgotten corners of the world, that the love of God may be made visible.

Deacons share in the pastoral ministry of the Church and in leading God's people in worship. They preach the word and bring the needs of the world before the Church in intercession. They accompany those searching for faith and bring them to baptism. They assist in administering the sacraments; they distribute communion and minister to the sick and housebound.

Deacons are to seek nourishment from the Scriptures; they are to study them with God's people, that the whole Church may be equipped to live out the gospel in the world. They are to be faithful in prayer, expectant and watchful for the signs of God's presence, as he reveals his kingdom among us.

<u>Priests</u> are called to be servants and shepherds among the people to whom they are sent. With their Bishop and fellow ministers, they are to proclaim the word of the Lord and to watch for the signs of God's new creation. They are to be messengers, watchmen and stewards of the Lord; they are to teach and to admonish, to feed and provide for his family, to search for his children in the wilderness of this world's temptations, and to guide them through its confusions, that they may be saved through Christ for ever. Formed by the word, they are to call their hearers to repentance and to declare in Christ's name the absolution and forgiveness of their sins.

With all God's people, they are to tell the story of God's love. They are to baptize new disciples in the name of the Father, and of the Son, and of the Holy Spirit, and to walk with them in the way of Christ, nurturing them in the faith. They are to unfold the Scriptures, to preach the word in season and out of season, and to declare the mighty acts of God. They are to preside at the Lord's table and lead his people in worship, offering with them a spiritual sacrifice of praise and thanksgiving. They are to bless the people in God's name. They are to resist evil, support the weak, defend the poor, and intercede for all in need. They are to minister to the sick and prepare the dying for their death. Guided by the Spirit, they are to discern and foster the gifts of all God's people, that the whole Church may be built up in unity and faith.
