Ramblings from the Rectory March 2022

For me March is a turning point in the year. The weather is beginning to change, and flowers are appearing, or have already appeared. Indeed, I read an article recently that stated that plants are now flowering on average a month earlier than they had in the past (https://royalsocietypublishing.org/doi/10.1098/rspb.2021.2456). This is based on data collected since the 18th Century. This will cause challenges and opportunities in the natural world, the consequences of which we can only guess at.

March is a pivot point in the year. The balance point between the cold of winter and the warmth to come. A time when I can just as easily see the glass half empty, as see the glass half full (opportunities vs challenges). After all the dark and the cold, I choose to look forward in hope. I choose to look forward to something better, particularly this year after all the Covid depravation that we have endured.

I look forward with hope, but as a realist too. I am far from perfect so there will be spiritual and emotional challenges ahead. I know that there will be huge practical challenges ahead too, with fuel and food price rises, being just two examples. I pray that these challenges can become opportunities too.

As I look forward with hope I know that I need to prepare the ground and allow God to plant the seeds of hope in me. I start by stopping blaming anyone else for my faults. I accept them as I receive the ash on Ash Wednesday (2nd March). Then I begin to prepare my mind and heart by making a choice to be part of a Lent Group and learn more about God's love. This year we are looking at how to keep our relationship with God vibrant, through prayer. I need to be practical too. I need to support Foodbank and other charities that seek to give practical help, support and dignity to those in need. Prayer and faith are hollow, without action. As I learn more about prayer, I want my life to reflect a deepened faith. After all, "my friends, what good is it to say you have faith, when you don't do anything to show that you really do have faith? Can that kind of faith save you? If you know someone who doesn't have any clothes or food, you shouldn't just say, " hope all goes well for you. I hope you will be warm and have plenty to eat."What good is it to say this, unless you do something to help? Faith that doesn't lead us to do good deeds is all alone and dead!" (James 2.14-17)

March is an inner and outer turning point in the year. I encourage you to join me in working now to make the hope to come a reality and not just wishful thinking.
