Ramblings from the Rectory

May is here! The start, lets hope, of a beautiful summer.

May begins with the Coronation Weekend. A celebration of our new king and of his place at the heart of this nation. As we come together to celebrate this historic occasion, I pray that we will be encouraged to serve others, reaching out to our neighbours, and celebrating the unity in diversity that makes our country so wonderful. King Charles III will be committing himself to a life of service. In response let us, in the words of our Archbishops, "commit joyfully to a life of service to God and one another; a commitment the king has exemplified throughout his life. We pray this would be a moment for all to encounter afresh the person of Jesus Christ – the servant King – and be renewed in our calling to serve Him by serving others."

This May also hosts some of the most important Christian festivals. On 18th May it is Ascension Day when we celebrate the return of Jesus to heaven to rule as King of kings for ever. Then on the last Sunday of May we have the feast of Pentecost (or Whit Sunday). Another celebration, this time of the sending of the Holy Spirit, to live in God's people all of the time. It is the Holy Spirit who changes us inside, making it possible for us to be more loving, caring, forgiving and generous than we ever thought possible. The Holy Spirit brings the power of God into this world for transformation and healing. All through the gift of faith.

During the time between Ascension Day and Pentecost, I ask all of you to join with me and with your fellow Christians around the world to pray that more and more people receive this gift of faith: That they come to know Jesus. This is a time known as "Thy Kingdom Come," we will be praying for these words from the Lord's Prayer to come to fulfilment. This is not so that we can fill our churches (although that would be welcome!). No, the reason that we pray for more people to find faith is because we know how good it is. We want others to share in that goodness, peace and contentment, and eternal life that Jesus offers.

There will be free Thy Kingdom Come prayer resources available in each of our churches for us to use individually and in our House Groups. Central to Thy Kingdom Come is "Praying for Five." Praying for five people that you know to come to faith. Why not practise now, then you'll be an expert by the time 18th May comes round!

For us, Christ's people, this May is a month of celebrations and hope.

May the risen Lord Jesus bless us with love, joy and peace. May he watch over us and renew us as he renews the whole of creation.

May he bless King Charles, both now and always, in the ways of humility and grace for his ministry among us. May we, with King Charles, echo his love in our hearts and lives. Amen.

Reshape us, good Lord,
until in generosity, in faith,
and in the expectation that
the best is yet to come,
we are truly Christ-like.
Make us passionate followers
of Jesus, rather than
passive supporters.
Make our churches places of radical discipleship

and if need be, despite us,
let your kingdom come. Amen.




