CURATE'S CURIOSITY



I have a confession: I enjoy superhero fiction. I enjoy superheroes, from Batman to the Avengers, to Buffy the Vampire Slayer. And I learned something fascinating recently.

Superheroes, as a genre, were born in 1938 by a Jewish immigrant to New York: Jerry Siegel. He heard what was happening to Jews in Europe and felt powerless in the face of unimaginable evil, wielding unimaginable forces of destruction. And he created Superman — a thoroughly good guy with unbelievable powers. Even Supe's Krypton name — Kal-el — spoke to the situation, in Hebrew this means 'voice of God'. As the world war began, so began the golden age of comic-books — Batman, Wonderwoman and Captain America. Millions of kids and adults needed, on some sort of unconscious level, to process the struggle of good and evil and power, and they did so with comic books.

The most confusing and difficult book of the Bible (for most people) is Revelation — the prophetic book that closes the Bible, and which gives us such phrases as apocalypse, armageddon, the 'four horsemen' and 666. Revelation belongs to a genre of writing that can be seen in the book of Daniel in the Old Testament, and in other books that were contemporary with the Bible, but didn't make the cut. It was a style of writing that was born of persecution — when people wondered 'What is the future? Where is God? Why is this happening? When will we have justice?' Daniel, Ezekiel and many other such books answered those questions with strange visions of a cosmic struggle, fought with angels and demons. When Revelation was written Christians were being killed for their faith by the powerful Roman emperor, Domitian. And so Revelation talks about the battle of good and evil on a cosmic scale, with unimaginable forces, but it ends in hope. God wins.

To this extent, Revelation works like superhero fiction. It isn't trying to be 'realistic', but it talks about reality on another level — evil seeking its own way, but good winning in the end. It steps away from the detail to paint the big picture in bold, primary colour images. Superman clearly isn't the Bible, but both Superman and Revelation express the 'voice of God' — and that voice is full of goodness and hope.
