RAMBLINGS FROM THE RECTORY

For me March is a turning point in the year. The weather is beginning to change, but is far from predictable (if English weather could ever be called predictable!). The garden is preparing to come to life with wonderful bulbs like daffodils and hyacinths adding swathes of colour and fragrance. That said, March can look back to the cold and snow of winter as easily as it looks forward to the warmer months to come. March is a pivot point. A time when I can just as easily see the glass half empty, as see the glass half full. After all the dark and the cold, I choose to look forward in hope. I choose to look forward to something better, even if that 'something better' might be some time to come.

I look forward with hope, but as a realist too. If the future is to be better, then I need to work now to make it so. When I grew more of my own vegetables, early March meant digging and planting rows and rows of potatoes. The same is true within me. The outer dark of winter often seeps into me. So for me the grey can replace the bright flame of faith. So for me March is a spiritual turning point too.

I accept who I am as I receive the ash on Ash Wednesday. As I receive that ash, I know too that God accepts me as I am. We both stand together at the starting line, ready to set off on a journey of growth and life restored. Ash Wednesday gives me the inner drive to begin the journey of Lent. The Lent Groups form an essential part of this. This year I am particularly excited to be looking at big questions, like "Why do bad things happen to good people?" and "Faith vs Science?" These are all part of the Church Army's "Why on earth?" course.

I for one am really looking forward to exploring faith with fellow pilgrims. Pilgrims together on the road to Easter.

Now I am back to where I began. March is an inner and outer turning point in the year. As we stand together at a balance point in the year, I encourage you to join me in working now to make the Easter hope a reality, and not just wishful thinking. God bless, Nigel.

NEW CHURCH ELECTORAL ROLL - 2019

Notice is hereby given that under the Church Representation Rules a new Church Electoral Roll is being prepared. All persons who wish to have their names entered on the new Roll, whether their names are entered on the present Roll or not, are requested to apply for enrolment..

Under the Church Representation Rules any persons are entitled to have their names entered on the roll if they:

- 1 are baptised and are aged 16 or over;
- 2 have signed a form of application for enrolment; and either
- 3 Living in the parish and a member of the Church of England or a Church in communion with the Church of England.
- 4 Not resident in the parish but a member of the Church of England (or a Church with which the Church of England is in communion) and has regularly attended worship in the parish during the six months prior to enrolment.
- A member in good standing of a Church which subscribes to the doctrine of the Holy Trinity and they are prepared to declare themselves a member of the Church of England, having regularly attended worship during the six months prior to enrolment.

Each parish will need to produce a new electoral roll before their annual meeting. If anyone has concerns they are to ask, and I will be happy to advise. God bless, Nigel - Rector
